The Education for Sustainability Committee works with staff and students across Imperial to help integrate sustainability, as broadly described by the Sustainable Development Goals into teaching and extra-curricular activities.

This includes:

Sustainability Literacy: teaching the core skills and competences necessary to understand and tackle sustainability problems to students and staff.

Application of Science to Sustainability: creating opportunities in the curriculum and through extra-curricular activities for students and staff to apply teaching and learning to tackle sustainability problems.

Sustainable Lab Practice: teaching by adopting best practice in laboratories.

We work with colleagues across all aspects of sustainability education to:

- promote and showcase existing good practice across Imperial.
- bring together a critical mass of expertise in sustainability education.
- provide a platform to coordinate, embed and promote sustainability education initiatives across Imperial.
- provide advice and training on developing and running sustainability education initiatives, including curriculum design and pedagogies.
- lead activities that contribute to external impact rankings.
- understanding market needs for sustainability skills.
