This information is deemed to be exempt from disclosure by virtue of the exemption at Section 43 (2) of the Freedom of Information Act, prejudice to commercial interests. Disclosure of this aspect of the negotiated commercial arrangement between the College and HyperionDev would be likely to have a detrimental impact on both HyperionDev and the University's ability to achieve value for money in future contracts of this nature. Disclosure of the remuneration agreed would also likely prejudice the commercial interests of HyperionDev by weakening its position in a competitive environment and revealing information of potential usefulness to its competitors.

Section 43(2) is a qualified exemption which requires us to consider whether the public interest in maintaining the exemption outweigh the public interest in disclosure. Whilst there is a legitimate public interest in openness and transparency in the activities of public authorities generally and in particular in the allocation of publicly funded money, we are aware of no public interest in disclosure of this specific information that would outweigh the need to protect the legitimate commercial interests of the parties in this case.

The College has no direct relationship with the UK Government in relation to the courses provided by HyperionDev and there is no agreement in place for the University to receive any payments from the UK Government in relation to those courses.
