	You will sign up to do the debate and then join a team and be assigned to either argue FOR (Pro) OR AGAINST (Con) on one of the following statements:
	"Mandatory immunisation is better for population health"
	"The UK screens for fewer new-born and childhood conditions than most other countries with similar resources. This is regrettable and many more conditions should be included"
	You will collaborate online to develop a presentation – you can use whichever format you think would be the most effective in making your case e.g., PowerPoint, role play, verbal argument. You should ensure that all team members get to present or participate. You should demonstrate that you have worked as a team, and you need to ensure that everyone does their fair share of the work. You can agree roles (such as 'Proposer' and 'Seconder').
	As a suggestion, your time could be organised like this: • Task 1: Identify individual knowledge & skills sets, areas of interest. Agree tasks & sub-teams

• Task 3: Confirm literature search strategy & agree date for findings submission

Task 4: Submit findings from different sub-teams

• Task 2: Identify roles

Task 5: Summarize evidence

Task 6: Agree presentation structure

- Task 7: Develop counterarguments & responses
- Task 8: Get power point presentation ready & material to support CA
- Task 9: Mock presentation

You can present your points in any way that you like, but <u>if</u> you want to create a PowerPoint that clearly illustrates your points, please upload it onto Insendi. You will be able to control the presentation yourself on the day using screen sharing in ZOOM.

On the day (in class):

- There will be an initial class vote taken to see who supports the statement
- The "Pro" team will present their case for 10 minutes
- The "Con" team will then present their case for 10 minutes
- The "Pro" team will then have 5 minutes for rebuttal
- The "Con" team will then have 5 minutes for rebuttal
- There will be 10 minutes for Questions from the floor
- There will be another class vote taken to see who **now** supports the statement

Submission Instructions	The accompanying document can be submitted via Turnitin before the deadline, so that you can self –assess your similarity score. If you are quoting a section of someone else's work, please ensure that you use quotation marks and indent the section. It is not enough to merely attribute the source.	

The completed assignment must be submitted on-line in Insendi. Details - Child Health Promotion Poster

Background

The lecture topics for this module are diverse and wide-ranging. The aim is to stimulate interest and raise interesting questions in your minds and not to cover all the potentially vast subject matter.

Assignment

Explore the application of child public health techniques in one chosen topic area e.g. breast feeding promotion, child mental health, or immunisation and propose a strategy for health promotion.

Conduct a literature review to discuss critically different aspects of your chosen subject and arrive at a balanced conclusion that is referenced with published literature.

Create a **Poster** to illustrate your Health promotion proposal.

The **accompanying document** should contain an abstract, a literature review, the text from the poster (with accurate word count) and academic referencing.

The structured abstract should be no more than 200 words - please include word count in brackets after this section.

Describe how you performed the literature search for your work using key words and include descriptive (summary) tables and figures as appropriate (no more than 4 please) and a brief critical review about what is currently understood about the topic. The literature review should consist of 500 words - please include word count in brackets after this section.

The text from the poster should exactly match that which is on the poster itself and should be no more than 500 words - please include word count in brackets after this section.

Please cite no more than 20 judiciously chosen references.

You will be requested to **present your poster** in a 'virtual conference'-like environment through the web-conference system (such as "ZOOM"). The session will be chaired by Heather Hanna, Course Teaching Fellow, and your fellow students will join the session. You will be requested to present the key ideas from your Clinical case in 5 minutes, followed by 3 minutes for questions.

Marks will be given for Style/Visual presentation and professional conduct in the presentation

Please ensure you use the following structure in the **Poster**:

- Title
- Background
- Strategy selected for Health Promotion
- Discussion This should cover why you have selected the strategy and how you expect that the implementation will improve the public health of children in the target population
- Conclusions
- Key references (max 5)
- Acknowledgements, if any

Accompanying Document:

Please ensure you use the following structure in the **Accompanying Document**:

- Abstract should contain the following section headings: Background, Strategy Selected, Discussion, Conclusions (with word count in brackets)
- Literature Review (with word count in brackets)
- Poster text (with word count in brackets)
- Academic references in Vancouver style

Presentation of PowerPoint:

- Present the key ideas from your poster in 5 minutes
- Q & A for 3 5 minutes

Marks will be given for Style/Visual presentation and professional conduct in the presentation
